Child Care in the Campus Community

The Penn Women's Center has compiled this informal directory of licensed child care centers in the University neighborhood as a special service to the Penn community. We recognize the importance of accessible and affordable child care if parents are to join and maintain their presence at the University. We also understand that many who come to the University are unfamiliar with child care resources in the community. This brochure has been developed to assist Penn parents as they plan for their child care needs.

The Penn Women's Center is not in a position to recommend or guarantee any center and we urge all parents to investigate thoroughly and select carefully. The Penn Women's Center acknowledges that for some parents even these centers may be too costly and therefore we recommend that parents also consult other child care resources as a means of identifying more affordable child care. Full and part-time employees of the University are eligible to obtain a printout of child care (including in home child care) in the area where they work or live through Child Care Systems, Inc. Contact the Benefit's Office of Human Resources for further information at 898-7281. (The fee for the service is \$6).

The following pages summarize the responses of 14 centers to a questionnaire regarding the services each offers. Though not all centers supplied comparable information, each did describe its general focus, hours, fees (subject to change from the time the information was gathered), as well as the various programs offered for children of different ages.





A Special Report by Penn Women's Center

All of the centers are licensed through the Pennsylvania Department of Public Welfare (D.P.W.), which indicates substantial compliance with regulations pertaining to health and safety, qualification of staff, equipment, and program content. In Pennsylvania a day care center is defined as a facility in which care is provided for seven or more children at any one time, in child care areas not being used as a family residence. The operator must receive authorization from D.P.W., which inspects, evaluates, and licenses these facilities.

Compiling this type of directory is an ongoing process, so any listing may contain information that is out-of-date by the time of publication. The Penn Women's Center, however, will continue to update its resource file which is available for examination in 119 Houston Hall.

Whether one chooses to use one of these centers, or makes alternate arrangements for child care, the Penn Women's Center encourages parents to thoroughly explore the following options in attempting to fulfill both parents' and child's best interests. Also it should be noted that the Penn Children's Center is the only day care center affiliated with the University. The center is sponsored by the School of Social Work.



Child Care Check List

Child care centers vary considerably in terms of both provisions and objectives. Ideally, a chosen center offers developmental programs that match the individual need of the child, reflect the parental values, and also meet the needs of the parents. Here is a check list of matters to consider while in the process of assessing the different centers.
